A letter of apology or explanation from yourself to the Court (optional)		
Any letters to the Court from your character referees;		
Any o	Any documents that support:	
	Your version as to what occurred and why it occurred (for example, text messages, emails, photographs etc.);	
	Your personal circumstances (i.e. – medical documents, employment documents etc.)
